7. Brief description in lay terms of the aim of the project, and outline of research questions (approx. 200 words):

A significant exploration is underway within the University of Otago to better understand the ecological worldviews/sustainability literacy/environmental literacy of Otago's students. A less-advanced project explores what university teachers think about these domains and what the implications are for them as University Teachers, their institution and higher education. A range of processes are underway or currently being developed to explore this domain, comprising semi-structured interviews, surveys and focus groups.

8. Brief description of the method. Please include a description of who the participants are, how the participants will be recruited, and what they will be asked to do:-

Within this ethics application, all participants will be teachers at the University of Otago, all will be volunteers and they will be asked to contribute to semi-structured interviews, surveys and focus groups. The research-instruments currently in use are the Revised New Ecological Paradigm scale (NEP) and an instrument under development named the Approaches to Sustainability Teaching Inventory (ASTI); both requiring participants to agree or disagree with a number of statements, and potentially add open ended comments. Other similar surveys may be used in the future. Interview questions will be open ended and seek to enable the participant to reflect on and describe their perceptions about the research field. Focus groups will enable participants to reach shared understanding of the domains in question.

9. Please disclose and discuss any potential problems: (For example: medical/legal problems, issues with disclosure, conflict of interest, etc)

There are no substantial ethical issues. All participant involvement will be voluntary and all data collected anonymous (to all but the researchers). All participants will be advised that they can withdraw from the study at any time, until such time as their data becomes anonymous. The issues involved in the research may be vital to our planet's survival but generally do not arouse strong passion in University Teachers relevant to ethical concerns related to research.

Where the data from the participants involves responses to questionnaires, participants will be informed that submitting their data provides their consent for their responses to be incorporated into the research. Where the data involves transcribed interviews or focus group

reports written consent will be obtained from all participants immediately prior to the interview.
