






#### Overview of GPP

GPP was designed to provide a consistent global standard for stakeholder engagement across the HIV prevention research life-cycle. Since its inception, the role of GPP has significantly expanded



#### AVAC's Work in 3-Ds

- Deliver communities of practice and regional hubs that support implementers across disease areas
- Document the experience of GPP to support implementers and disseminate GPP lessons-learned beyond trial site and champions
- Demonstrate that value of formalizing GPP in the research process

### International Impact


National adaptations, including innovative mechanisms for implementation, increase the relevance of GPP for national stakeholders and country-specific contexts.
