She has developed and implemented the iCARE-Haaland training model in collaboration with doctors and nurses in nine countries. Her focus in recent years has been communication and emotional competence skills training for health personnel. The iCARE-Haaland model uses reflective learning over time to inspire deep and sustainable learning. Ane has worked in 30 countries for research institutes, universities and international organisations in social science research, education and curriculum development, journalism, professional development training, and photography.		
		Mwanamvua Boga is a nurse manager and a lead trainer. She has over 20 years hands on experience in acute paediatric nursing expertise and clinical research practice, working at a busy paediatric research unit at the Kilifi County Hospital, Kenya. Her work includes care of critically ill children, nursing management, administrative responsibilities and capacity building. Over the last 15years, she has		

		extensively been involved in training health providers and research staff (at hospitals and Universities in Kenya, and The Gambia) on communication skills and emotional management using reflective practice and experience-based learning methods.
