Torres is a graduate of a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and Master of Arts in Nursing (cum laude) from the University of Santo Tomas and obtained his Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing degree from the University of the Philippines Manila, where he worked in the development of the Model of patient readiness for surgery. He was awarded a post-doctoral visiting scholarship at Duke University School of Nursing last Fall 2019, where he learned the process of developing systematic reviews, advanced health interventions, and clinical simulations. As a Clinician, he worked as a perioperative nurse at the University of Santo Tomas, and he supervised students in the undergraduate programs in their operating room experience and adult health clinical exposure. As an Educator, He is a Full Professor at the University of Santo Tomas College of Nursing and Graduate School, handling professional courses on Adult Health Nursing, Fundamentals of Nursing, and Nursing Research. He is currently the Program Point Person for the Master in Nursing Education (MNE), which is an innovative 1-year program geared to train future nurse educators. He concurrently serves as the Metro Manila Area Representative of the Global Society of Philippine Nurse Researchers Inc.
